Biographical Sketch

Anne Sullivan Soydan, Sc.D, CPRP

Anne Sullivan-Soydan is a full-time assistant professor and a two time alum (MS '87 and Sc.D. '99) at Sargent College of Health and Rehabilitation Sciences at Boston University, where she has taught and mentored and supervised students for almost forty years. She teaches courses in human development and disability, abnormal psychology, and counseling skills and provides academic advising to students in the Behavioral Health program in the Department of Occupational Therapy. She also taught the online preparation courses and conference institutes nationally and internationally for the CPRP, the national certification of the Psychiatric Rehabilitation Association. A member of the board of directors of the Massachusetts Psychiatric

Rehabilitation Collaborative, she is co-chair of the Training and Education committee, providing workforce development for providers and people with lived experience of psychiatric disability.

Anne has spent much of the past forty years developing and disseminating Supported Education initiatives for young adults with psychiatric disabilities as they return to college. She is the author and editor of several publications, book chapters, and an edited textbook on supported education. A Mary Switzer fellowship recipient, she was awarded the LeRoy Spaniol Educator award by the Psychiatric Rehabilitation Association in 2015, and in 2018, the Whitney R. Powers Award for Teaching Excellence, given annually to recognize an outstanding teacher from the Sargent faculty.
